

Instructions to be followed for approval to train in the US

If you are interested in coming to the United States for flight training, you must first obtain the right to train in the US. Depending on your citizenship, you will choose from two paths to approval for flight training.

1. If your training will take less than 90 days and you are from one of the visa waiver countries, you may arrive in the US as a visitor without a visa. The visa waiver countries are:

Andorra, Australia, Austria, Belgium, Brunei, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Japan, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Monaco, the Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, Portugal, San Marino, Singapore, Slovakia, Slovenia, South Korea, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, United Kingdom.

If you are from one of these countries, you should go to the website:

Follow the instructions to apply for flight training. Fill in the form to create a new student account. Once you have created the account, you may apply for training.

Use the following information:

Provider: Honey B LLC dba Corvallis Aero Service
Training Request Course Name: Initial
Training Request Aircraft Type: (R22 or Cessna152)
Training Request Category: 3
Estimated Training Request Date: (must be within 180 days)

When you complete and submit the information request, we will receive a request for confirmation. When we confirm the request, you will receive the instructions to submit your processing fee. You will receive acknowledgement and then you may arrive in the US for training. This stage normally takes two weeks. When you arrive here, we will take you to have your fingerprints taken and they will be sent to Washington, DC. Two to three days later you will receive approval for training.

2. If you are from any other country, or if you wish to stay in a program that will take more than 90 days, you must follow the above procedure plus you must obtain a Visa to enter the US. This Visa is issued by application through the Student and Exchange Visitor Program.

You should email us the following information:

Family Name
First Name
Date of Birth
Gender
Country of Birth
Country of Citizenship
Address including Postal Code
Proposed length of stay (usually 12 months)
Place of stay in the US (usually at Corvallis)

You must be prepared, through a bank statement, to show that you have the available money to receive training plus \$500 per month living expenses.

We will prepare and mail you an I-20 form. You will use this form to apply for a student visa. You will make an appointment to take this form, your passport and your proof of funds to the nearest US Embassy or Consulate.
